Any undersize fish (State Law) presented at the weigh will result in DQ ... be sure of your fish before weigh in. Weigh-masters will not consider excuses or provide crying towels!



### **Information and Rules:**

WHEN/WHERE: SUNDAY - November 21-Sunrise till weigh-in - All Oahu shores. ENTRY FEE: \$30.00 per diver to cover awards,

pupus and banquet.

WEIGH-IN: Frank Farm's house at 1:00 p.m. - 3446 Pakui St. - ph. 732-1756

SCORING: Weigh masters, Dennis Okada and Frank Farm

1. Only goatfish, 11" minimum, will count towards trophies.

2 Only 3 largest goats will score.

3. Scoring by total weight. No points per fish. Tie decided by total length.

4. Ponuhunohu 12" minimum, papio 12" minimum, and toau 8" minimum will be weighed individually. Prizes awarded.

AWARDS:

1. Total weight - Champion, 2nd and 3rd place.

2. Largest goatfish - Champion, 2nd and 3rd place

3. Special prizes - largest papio (under 10 lbs.), ponuhunohu and toau.

4. No scooping of more than two awards per diver, one for goats and one for special categories.

# **DIVE RULES:**

1. No boats, kayaks, motorized propulsion or scuba.

2. All entries must be from shorelines of Oahu.

3. Fish lost due to bad shot is fair game to all other divers.

4. No mutilated fish will be scored.

5. All divers must weigh their fish.

6. Judge's decision is final. (Weigh master)

DIVE SAFETY ~~~ dive with a buddy ... for his safety and yours!

PRECAUTIONS: Divers required to use a dive flag.

Divers highly recommended carrying a dive knife.

Each diver is responsible for his own safety don't dive somewhere you can't handle, respect ocean conditions and your limits.

Weigh - in will not begin until all divers are accounted for. If you are unable to be back in time please call in at Frank's house. (732-1756) Only a FUN tournament - HAVE A FUN DIVE!!!
