y2K is here and a TAKO HUNT fun meet is first on the agenda. The date is January 16th There will be 3 categories of 3 places in each category.

1. Total Wt. 3 largest

2.Longest tako

3. Heaviest

A 2 lb min size for weighing. No scooping in tako categories. A special award for the heaviest fish caught with a 3 prong.-Divers may spear 1 each for consideration of weigh in. 12" min. Opelukala, Horn kala, Aawa, Awaawa, Mu, Enenui, Roi Toau, Uhu, Wahanui, goats. 18"min Blue water fish, Awa, Kaku, Kahala, Uku, Jack family.

This tako/fun meet is open to all comers---AHK and non members may join in! Invite a friend to join you. This is a swim out tournament and you get to go wherever you wish off the shores on the Island of Oahu. You may enter the water anytime after Sunrise on Sunday January 16trh and must be at Frank's house for the weigh in by 2 PM. There is a \$12 entry fee that will cover all costs, prizes and food at the weigh in. You must mail in or otherwise apply and get your \$12 entry fee by Friday the 14th of January to Myles Yoshikawa, 3956444, or Dennis Okada 6779010. Do it now! After that date the late entry fee will be \$15. - however you must call and let us know if you are participating before the start time. Fee will cover costs to the club for awards, food, cold drinks, etc As usual, the numbers are important to us for planning purposes! We're looking forward to seeing you there with the rest of the squids, either with or without your giant octopus!

Getting ready for the US Nationals for Y2000 - the competition will be held in California and Hawaii already has one team qualified (Da Defending Champions) and we will have the elimination's for the other 3 teams... Since he is already qualified, Gene Higa is the chairman of the meets to select the rest of the teams...Gene has formulated the following schedule: Applications with waivers for the Team and/or Individual elimination's are available at Maui Sporting Goods, Kapahulu or call Gene 4226727 or 6760193, Dennis 6779010, Terrence 8365009, or Frank 7321756, and a set will be mailed to you. All entrants must belong or join Alii Holo Kai when entering.

## US National Team Elmimination 1 team / Qualification February 13, 2000

Boundary: Rabbit Island (Kailua Side) - to - Mokuloa Island (Kailua Side)

Qualify: 1 team, minimum of 3 teams must enter.

Applications: Must be received at least 14 days prior to event or by 1/31/00

Alternate to be picked after 3/5/00 up to date of commitment 3/25/00

Team entry fee for 3 members = \$45. Sunday - February 13th 7 AM Registration/Briefing at Bellows Beach, near inner guard post. Dive until 2 PM...All competitors must be checked at this site before and after their dive. A checker at the site will verify, segregate and contain your catch to be taken to the weigh in. Scouting OK but no taking of fish from February 1st.

#### Individual Eliminations 2 US National Teams Qualification March 5, 2000

Boudary: Wailupe to Black Point

Qualify's 2 additional teams to represent Hawaii

Entry Fee: \$12 per individual

#### . Fish Rules applies to both tournaments—must attend briefing/rules and review

Fish\_Limits: Limit 20 fish per competitor. Limit of 4 per fish list. Limit of 10 knifefish\* total per competitor. Any combination from list #1 through #5 of the Eligible Fish List and not to exceed 4 of any one type on the list. If a competitor exceeds the limits, then the following penalties will take effect: 1) If more than 20 total, but not more than 4 per list, then only the largest fish from the total catch will be disqualified; 2) But if more than 20 total, and also more than 4 per list, then the largest fish from the total catch and the list will both be disqualified. 3) If more than 10 knives total, then the biggest knife will be disqualified. Do not discard any eligible speared fish in order to exchange it for another of higher points. If any competitor violates this rule, he will be disqualified.

Eligible Fish List: 12 inches minimum: \*1- Opelu kala, \*2- Palani \*3- Horn kala \*4- Pualu \*5- Naenae, 6- Aawa, 7- Awaawa, 8- Kumu (goat fishes all species), 9- Mu, 10- Nenue, 11- Roi, 12-Toau, 13- Uhu (parrot fish -all species), 14- Wahanui, 15- Hilu

18 inches minimum: Awa, Kaku, Kahala, Uku, Ulua/Papio, blue water fishes.

Dues are again payable as we go into the new year of 2000 da good news is that the cost of the dues has never changed for many years at \$25 — for single membership and \$35 for a family plan if you are married — this covers your spouse and children. We have traditionally been able to manage our finances and to invite you as a member to attend the XMAS PARTY BANQUET free—and of course it you had a family plan that included your spouse—da not so good news—is that the Executive committee has recommended that the dues be increased to \$30 single and \$40 family effective April 1, 2000. We will be voting on this increase at the AHK meeting and weigh in for the Tako hunt. So—get your dues in as soon as possible and before 4/1/2000 and you will pay at the bargain rate—before the increase! You should consider joining the *Underwater Society of America* (a must if you are selected to compete in the US Nationals in Florida) for just a mere \$15. The Underwater Society of America sponsors the National Freediving Competitions (among other water related sports) and is our link to the World Meet, and has insurance included in their dues. ...
