2007 Alii Holo Kai 3 Prong"Get

Once again, the Alii Holo Kai (AHK) dive club got together to have their annual 3 prong tournament. On Sunday, February 25, twenty two members participated in this event on the island of Oahu. The meet was held at Kaiona Beach Park in Waimanalo.

This was a swim from shore meet and you had to dive with a partner. This was a four hour dive and you could travel anywhere by foot, as long as you returned by 12:30 pm with your partner. Other rules stated that your three prongs had to be 8 feet or less without any barbs and the rubber sling had to be attached to a spear. Each diver could only spear 10 small fish and the minimum sizes were 5 ½ inches; Aholehole, Aweoweo, Kole, Manini, Menpachi, Pakuikui, Toao and Poopaa and also 10 large fish, but only 2 per species and the minimum sizes for each were 12 inches; Aawa, Enenue, Lai, Kumu (all goats), Roi, Pualu, Palani, 13 inches; Uhu, 17 inches; Opelu Kala and Papio (jacks), 15 inches; Horn Kala. Mark your calendars, for this fish list is just a reminder to prepare you for

next years outing which will be held about the same time.

After the morning briefing, row call and a prayer, the divers casually either made their way to suit up and gather their gear or was already prepared for a quicker start.

Mean while the food was being prepared by Chef Junior Afalla to get ready for the hungry guys after the dive.

Fun Dive

To sum up the four hour dive, I would say that the majority of divers who did well chose to dive in a depth of 15 feet in pounding surf. There were many cracks that housed the swift moving Enenue. This area was challenging, you had to constantly bob and kick hard against the oncoming swell and at times duck under the sets of breaking surf to avoid losing your mask. The school of Enenue moved in and out of cracks rapidly and timing the fish to get a steady shot was difficult. The fish almost had to stay still for a moment. The thought was to get your two fish and move on for other species.

The first place winner in the total weight division went to Shay Motonaga. Shay jokingly said that "It's not about

the prizes", "it's about bragging rights for the day", but "I was hoping to win a 3 prong".

The Hamburger Steak prepared by Junior was huge. I could only eat one that was two inch thick and easily weighed a half pound; some ate two said Frank. Along with Brown gravy, Macaroni salad, Beef Stew, rice and other donated grinds, the desire for food soon vanished and the "doggy bags" were plentiful.

After the awards were handed out and before the days end, the gang cleaned all the "Kole" that was speared, the "Wok" was fired up and Terry Yonashiro prepared his golden brown, deep fried "Kole" for snack that was gone in no time. The rest of the catch was either given away to anyone to take home or went to charity, nothing was wasted.

The 2007 United States

Nationals will be held at Noyo Harbor (Fort Bragg, Mendocino County, California on Thursday, August 9, 2007. Central California Council of Diving Clubs (CenCal) is hosting this 1day paddleboard/kayak event to be followed by an excellent awards banquet the following evening. Although we have most of the details, a web site is to be established soon so everyone can get the ongoing specifics. As such AHK announces the elimination dive and this single meet will qualify up to 3 men's

teams and 2 women's teams (2 persons) to determine who will represent our club.

AHK ELIMS/QUALIFICATION MEET

Date: Sunday, April 22, 2007

Location: Primary: Waialee (Kuulima

Pt. to Sunset Beach Pt.)

Alternate: Waimanalo Beach Park to Makapu Lighthouse

Eligibility requirements to participate in Qualification/Elimination meet.

- 1. Only applications received by Terrence Takahata, 5210 Likini St. #404 Hono Hi 96816. Telephone 836-5009 on or before Monday April 9,2007.
 - a) Must be a paid 2007 member of AHK (\$30), 18 years or older. Can join when submitting entry with dues.
 - b) Submitted membership dues for the Underwater Society of America (\$15) for 2007.
 - c) Application and Entry fee ()\$20) received by Terrence NLT 8 PM Monday April 9th. Form enclosed or call to get one.
- 2. On meet day
 - a) Dive Flag and knife.
 - b) Serviceable cooler with 20 or more pounds of ice. Bring your cold drinks

Declared Teams and Individuals.

Divers may declare as a 3-member team prior to eliminations, and if all finish

within the top 9, then they would be a team. If only two of the declared members qualify, they may still remain together, and the third member will be an individual diver coming from the top of the qualifying list. If no teams exist (qualify) then the top 3 individuals became a team.

The teams will be established with the above criteria. Once teams are established, members cannot be moved from team to team. If a member drops off a team, the replacement will be provided from the individual team list by place of finish. New team members can only be chosen from those who entered this elimination. Obviously, since not all situations can be accounted for, the final decision(s) rests with the committee of AHK President Frank Farm, VP & Overall AHK Competition Director Dennis Okada, and one AHK noncompeting member.

Once a diver qualifies for a team, he/she will have 14 days to turn in a letter of intent to participate in the 2007
Nationals. \$100 deposit per diver to declare participation must be submitted. This \$100 will be refunded the day after the Nationals if you did participate and not pull out. If a diver does not respond by the due date or turns down qualification, then that diver would no longer be eligible.

RULES:

1. Start through marked entry area. You are allowed to return to shore only through this marked are, (i.e., lose, forget, replace gear, etc.) Dropping off fish will not be allowed during the competition. You must let an

- official know what you are doing. At no time can a competitor leave the water and touch shore outside of the marked limits.
- 2. Everyone required to check-in On Time.
- 3. Electronic equipment: ONLY watch, light and GPS.
- 4. No free shafts
- 5. Only muscle powered crafts and swimming allowed.
- 6. No chumming.
- 7. No spearing of fish allowed in dive location as of April 1st.

***** 15 Fish Max / 3 per list

- 1. One point per pound / One point per fish. Maximum 16 points for any fish.
- 2. Fish measurement: nose to center of fork.
- 3. Fish Minimum sizes:
- 12" Palani, Pualu, Aawa, Hilu, Roi, Toau, Nenue, Mu, and all Goats.
- 13" All Uhu's
- 15" Horn Kala
- 17" Opellu kala, Uku, Awa, Awa awa, Oio, all Jacks, Kahala, Kaku, Kawelea, all Blue Water Fish (i.e. Ono, Tunas, Bill Fish, Mahimahi)

Discrepancies addressed as follows. If your catch:

- *Consist of more than 15 fish, then the largest will be removed.
- *Includes more than 3 per list, then largest of that species will be removed.
- *Undersized fish by these rules, but not breaking State law, then that fish will be removed.
